

"GRACE SHERWOOD"

At our January meeting, Belinda Nash presented a wonderful program show-casing the story of Grace Sherwood; the only "Convicted Witch" tried by water in Virginia's history. She is to be commended and deserves our support with her on-going efforts to see this historical injustice rectified through exoneration, and the creation of a bronze commemorative statue to be located at The Ferry Plantation House.

The statue will be unveiled on the 300th Anniversary of the Grace Sherwood trial, on July 10, 2006. THE LYNNHAVEN HOUSE

At our January meeting Jim Fletcher, the Civic League's Second Vice President, briefed the 44 members in attendance on the effort by The Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities (APVA) to sell the "Lynnhaven House" on Wishart Road to the City of Virginia Beach.

We have determined that the City appears to be in favor of purchasing the property to enhance it's tourist and community educational opportunities. On January 23, our Civic League sent a letter to each City Council member supporting and encouraging the acquisition of this historic landmark. A copy of our letter and the Mayor's acknowledgement is posted on the Civic League Website.

This is a complex transaction, and while the purchase is not a "Done Deal," the City has assumed the active management of the facility as of April 1st. More to come!



WHY BE A CUB SCOUT?

Cub Scouts do fun things with other kids! They get to wear a cool uniform, go places and see things. They play all kinds of sports and build things, like race cars and bird houses. Want to learn a secret code? Want to learn about wild animals? Want to spend time with your friends at a summer camp? Join Cub Scouting!

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Cub Scouting is a year-round family program designed for boys who are in the first grade through fifth grade (or 7, 8, 9, and 10 years of age). Cub Scouting members join a Cub Scout pack and are assigned to a den, usually a neighborhood group of six to eight boys grouped by age or grade. Dens of Tiger Cub Scouts (first-graders), Wolf Cub Scouts (second-graders), Bear Cub Scouts (third-graders), and Webelos Scouts (fourth- and fifth-graders) meet weekly.

Once a month, all of the dens and family members gather for a pack meeting under the direction of a Cubmaster and pack committee. PACK 475 meets the last Friday of each month in the Pembroke Meadows Elementary School Cafeteria.

TUESDAY, MAY 2ND IT'S TIME TO VOTE !!! " MARK YOUR CALENDAR "



There are 6 City Council seats up for re-election. YOU GET TO CAST A VOTE FOR EACH SEAT - NO MATTER WHERE YOU LIVE! In 2004 only 16.7% of the registered voters showed up at the polls. Too many people think they can only vote for a candidate who will represent the district they live in, and a candidate for each of the At-Large seats. "Not So!"

There are 4 District Seats open, and 2 At-Large seats. Louis Jones is running unopposed in the Bayside District, and Peter Schmidt is not seeking re-election for his At-Large seat.

Messrs. Maddox, Reeve and Wood represent the Beach, Princess Anne and Lynnhaven Districts respectively, and Mr. Villanueva represents the second At-Large seat. Each of these gentlemen are seeking re-election. All four opposed encumbents have at least one opposition candidate running against them. Interestingly, there are 10 candidates on the ballot for two At-Large seats.

Virginia Beach is being challenged at every corner. We all need to get out and vote! Let's make sure we elect the right people - with the right vision for the City.

SPRINGTIME SAMPLING AT THE LYNNHAVEN HOUSE

Come welcome in spring at the historic Lynnhaven House with two programs that offer something to delight everyone!

On Tuesday, April 21, 2006, the historic house will celebrate Historic Garden Week from 2:30 p.m.—4:30 p.m. with a variety of spring activities and garden related tours of the 1725 house. As they tour the historic house, guests will enjoy hearing about the many various ways that early colonial settlers used the herbs that they grew. Visitors may also sip mint tea and enjoy "ginger cakes" as they watch candied violets being made inside the new Colonial Educational Center. Admission to tour the historic site is by Virginia Beach Garden Tour block ticket, which is available at the Adam Thoroughgood House, 1636 Parish Road in Virginia Beach.

Bayside History Trail, on Saturday, May 20, 2006, 10:00 a.m.—4:00 p.m. highlights colonial lifestyles of early settlers in the Bayside Area. This free event will offer something to please everyone as visitors learn about the uses of historic herbs by making their own herb chart to take home. Samples of herbal tea may be enjoyed while visitors examine the values of herbal remedies and try their hand at preparing herb "medicinals." Tours of the historic Lynnhaven house will focus on the lifestyle of the family that lived there in the early 18th-century.
